Local Church Values

The Annual Church Meeting last month was an opportunity to thank all who support St Mary Magdalene's in a variety of roles, to elect officers and hear reports. In my own report I reflected on the Easter faith and the need for doubt and questioning too.

There are timeless truths on the journey of faith to which I increasingly find myself reaching in times of challenge and change. There are three in particular that seem to me to be constantly present but which I'd like to see us reclaim, highlight and name specifically.

First, that faith is in its nature a journey, hence **Pilgrimage** is of the essence of our life, searching, looking, persevering. There is to be no Turtledove Pilgrimage this year but how can we build on the lessons that it has taught us over the last seven years? There is the environmental issue that has been highlighted literally on our doorstep with the possibility of losing the Glebe land to development. But that folk song of love and lament is not without hope.

Secondly is the ancient idea of **Sanctuary**. Security and safety are not new ideas although recent years have seen them rebranded, so to speak, under the heading of Safeguarding. There is a danger of seeing this in negative terms as covering ourselves against human failings and damaging intentions of suspicion. Each of us have our vulnerabilities. My vision is of a church where we need not be afraid of weakness and fragility but draw on the strength and support of others.

Finally, at the risk of stating the obvious is the timeless value of **Prayer**. Rusper's open house of prayer is a powerful symbol. The presence of the Easter Christ depicted in our window and proclaimed in the words of the Gospel is to be found though not exclusively among these hallowed stones or even in the beauty of the light through the window depicting the

wounded but risen Christ. This is the vision and impetus behind our North aisle project. Prayer is grounded in the practical. It finds physical expression in bodies and buildings. There are at least as many approaches to prayer as there are people, but our eucharistic tradition highlights that all prayer is grounded in joyful thanksgiving and I thank each and every one of you for what you bring to it and will bring in the coming twelve months.

Sanctuary, Prayer and Pilgrimage are not named in order of priority but as equal elements in a spiritual conversation in which I look forward to our deeper participation in the coming year.

RUSPER CHRONICLE

"From Rusper to Kenya -the adventures of a farm girl from Rusper" – part love story, part amazing account of human endeavour, and a remote farm in Kenya called Rusper Farm. The link between them was Myra Knight, born in 1876, the tenth child of twelve, and brought up at Baldhorns in Rusper. She loved tending the cattle and horses on Baldhorns Park Farm but she wanted to know more about agriculture so went off to Reading University and became the first woman to graduate in dairying and cheese making. Here love struck and she met her future husband, Joe Milton, who had bought a large farm on the edge of the Rift Valley in Kenya – and who also needed to learn more about farming. So, in 1914 Myra sailed to Mombasa, married Joe in Mombasa Cathedral and went off to the farm which they called Rusper Farm. Here followed many years of endeavour, experimenting with different crops and stock. Another farm was bought, Soltai Farm, run by Myra and where she opened a farm shop. This was passed on to an Indian

group which led to a multinational business, Soltai Holdings Limited. Myra had one daughter, Joan, who became Mrs Reeder and emigrated to Australia. Sadly, Rusper Farmhouse, built by Joe, is now derelict.

Ralph Kaufmann told us the story, only revealing at the end that he was the "boy next door" to Rusper Farm, riding over to visit on his motorbike – but now living in Newdigate. It was a fascinating evening thanks to Ralph's research and storytelling.

We discovered Rusper has other Kenyan connections. Living at Pucks Croft in the early 1930s was Lady Coryndon, widow of Sir Robert Coryndon, Governor and Commander in Chief for Kenya and High Commissioner for Zanzibar till his death in 1922. She and her four children came to Rusper in the late 1920s and took an active part in village life before moving to Chowles Lodge, Lambs Green and finally to Worthing Road Horsham.

Also did you know that the first man to WALK the length of Africa, from the Cape to Cairo in 1900 lived at Venters in Rusper in the 1920s? This was Major Ewart Grogan, nicknamed The Leopard by the Kikuyu, a maverick character, who ended up owning half a million acres of land in Kenya.

In complete contrast, Catherine told us about witches marks, strange marks made on beams to deter witches from entering houses, some of which had been found at Averys and are probably to be found in other houses in the village. We'd like to know if you find any crosses, inverted Ws or any other unexplained marks scratched on beams, probably over doorways or fireplaces.

It's not just about supporting our local farmers and artisans; it's about bringing the freshest, most mouth-watering delights to your table. There are so many hidden gems to be found on the shelves of our little shop, from coffee, eggs, bread, meats, cheeses, even beverages, all produced by local people in our local counties of Sussex and Surrey.

For almost a quarter of a century, our shop has stood as a testament to what community can achieve. Many community owned shops of its kind have sadly closed their doors, however, Rusper Village Stores continues on in supporting our community. RUSPER LOSES A GOOD FRIEND Valerie Bowles 15/02/33 – 06/02/24

I've only known Valerie for a couple of years even though we've both been in the village for a long time. She was easy to talk to and interesting to listen to. She was funny, stoic, loved her puzzles and was emphatic about looking her best. As time went by, her eyesight deteriorated but she still managed to keep up to date with current affairs and books with the help of her many technical aids.

She was born the middle of three children in Edgeware, sadly losing her mother when she was only 22 and became a mum to her youngest brother. She left school at 18 with 3 A levels and worked for Clerical Medical. Valerie and her husband, Ken, moved to Rusper in 1986 and immediately threw themselves into local activities - Ken as treasurer of the Village Hall and a founding member of the Horsham Probus Group; Valerie, as secretary of the local branch of Family Support Work and both were regular members of Rusper Church. They played short mat bowls, bridge and tennis and joined local rambling groups. Valerie volunteered at the League of Friends cafe in Horsham Hospital, was a member of the WI and Tuesday Matters, as well as Rusper Chat and the Parish Magazine committee. She delivered the Parish Magazines well into her eighties and did the banking for the Church as well as the Magazine.

She made a lot of friends in the village who were a great source of support to her when she was widowed in 2005 and later when her own health suffered.

She was so proud of her children and grandchildren; her granddaughter gaining an engineering degree, her two grandsons gaining skills in computer theatre and musical skills.

She never lost her mental capacity - still doing Wordle in hospital and keeping up with the news and sport through her digital Telegraph subscription. She even wanted to know what was going on in the Australian Open just a week before she died!

I will miss her and Rusper will too. Judy Butler

Summary of Rusper Parish Council meeting & Planning Committee meeting – March 2024

Present: M Cooke (Chair), Cllrs. G Hussey (Vice Chair), G Sallows, M Fillmore, F Maitland-Smith, R Gatt, S White, M Fenton, District Councillor Liz Kitchen, District Councillor Tony Hogben

Declaration of Interests – None

Climate Crisis – The Council acknowledged that there is currently a climate crisis, and to ensure that all decisions made within meeting have consideration to this.

Minutes of previous meeting – it was RESOLVED to approve the Minutes meeting held on 27th February 2024.

Reports from other Authorities – District Councillor Tony Hogben – food waste being mandated and soon there will be food waste collections from all Horsham residential properties. This is still in the process of being organized and further information will be announced later in the year. The Drill Hall has been sold/donated to the Lifespring Church but it will continue to be used for community use and will be run under the Lifespring Church within the current covenants; it will remain a community asset.

District Councillor Liz Kitchen – noted that the Rusper Parish Litter pick was hugely impressive.

Active Planning Applications

DC/24/0392 – Hyders Farmhouse, Bonnetts Lane, Ifield RH11 0NY – Erection of a building to cover existing sand school – it was RESOLVED no objection to this application.

Reports from Representatives

Clir Marion Fenton – Cooks Meadow streetlighting. 2 lights not working, 1 is faulty. Residents do want the streetlights repaired rather than dark skies.

Clir Malcolm Fillmore – Gatwick – Night Noise Consultation is due by the end of May. There are 2 further reports due on medial effects of night noise and particulates. Gatwick have announced their annual profits.

Clir Simon White – Working with WSCC Highways with regard to traffic calming in the village.

Clir Ritchie Gatt – Proposed changes to the Village Hall access, toilets, heating, decoration, including new curtains.

Clir Geoff Hussey – There is no news on the new PCSO for the area. Noted PCSO Erica Baxter is just for rural concerns such as farms and wildlife.

Clir Michelle Cooke – Horsham District Old People's Forum – it was reported that there were community pharmacy problems due to lack of funding and access to prescriptions is becoming a problem; this is under constant review by the NHS (Integrated Care System) and Health England. Meals on Wheels was also discussed with a taste test at the next meeting – all run by WSCC. Village Agent – the appointment is going ahead with interviews to appoint a new person top the role.

Annual Paris Meeting 25th April 2024

The Council considered the agenda. It was **agreed** to include SWOI – Cllr Fenella Maitland-Smith to arrange. Rural Crime Officer Erica Baxter and the new PCSO – Cllr G Hussey to arrange; M Fenton Dancing – Cllr M Fenton to arrange; Gatwick Expansion – Cllr M Fillmore to be covered by the Councillor himself if he cannot persuade a guest speaker; Sports Club – Cllr G Sallows to update as he is also the Chairman of the Committee. Carry to next meeting.

Rusper Sports Club - Rusper Sports Club Management

A grant has been applied for to finish the repair of the tennis court.

Gatwick

The Council received the report from Cllr Malcolm Fillmore which is also available on the website under the dedicated Gatwick page. Noted Clerk to upload the other reports issued.

Annual Litter Pick

The annual litter pick was held on 24th March; 180 bags were collected along with WSCC signage and other larger items. The Council thanks the residents for their support. It was agreed that in future decision on the date will be made 2 months ahead of the pick so that an advert can be put into the magazine within the deadline.

Next meetings are the Annual Parish Meeting on 25th April at 7.30pm and the Combined Parish Council meeting on Tuesday, 30th April 2024 commencing at 7pm.
