Remembering

Watching my Dad lovingly polish his army boots is a lasting memory. Spit and polish followed by the rhythmic assault of brush against leather. Then, the alchemy of warming the back of an old spoon to create the final mirror shine on the toecap.

Shortly after D Day Dad found himself on the beaches. He was not required to wade ashore under gunfire, because the enemy had been pushed back. He was one of the second wave of veterans who were designated as *dry shod*.

Remembrance Sunday will soon be upon us again. With only weeks until Christmas, and to the marching rhythm of an army on the move we will not long afterwards be hearing again from the Prophet Isaiah:

'For all the boots of the tramping warriors and all the garments rolled in blood shall be burned as fuel for the fire....' The military march of a thousand feet is brought to a stop by the birth of a child. The relentless repetitive crunch of boots on the ground is replaced by a cry of hope 'for unto us a child is born and he will be called the Prince of Peace.' You don't understand another person, it is said, until you walk a mile in their shoes, and such mutual respect is a step on the path to the peace needed not as some dreamy aspiration but with ever greater urgency.

On 1 November we are invited to share with our neighbours at All Saints Roffey their Feast of Title at which I have the joy of preaching and celebrating. Do join us. Refreshments will follow. On 2 November at our 10:15am service we remember departed loved ones by name and particularly pray for those bereaved in the last 12 months.

VILLAGERS CONNECT NEWS

Do we need a transport solution in Our Villages?

Many of us in Colgate, Faygate and Rusper know how difficult it is to get around without a car. With only a very limited bus service, it can feel almost impossible to reach the shops, health appointments and community activities. This often leaves us feeling isolated and cut off from the wider community.

West Sussex County Council has introduced a scheme called Book-a-Bus in some parts of the county. It works like a flexible bus service - instead of a fixed timetable, you can book a seat, choose a local pick-up point, and travel when it suits you. The operator then checks for available slots and confirms your booking. It's affordable, accessible and concessionary passes are accepted. Would you use something like this scheme if it was available?

Sadly, our villages north of Horsham are not included in this scheme. Do you believe this needs to change? Tell us what you think about local transport in the area would you like a regular bus service in and between the villages? To give our residents the freedom to stay connected.

Rusper Parish Council Round-Up

Updates from September 2025 Meetings

September was a particularly busy month for Rusper Parish Council, with three key meetings — a Full Council session, a Planning Committee meeting, and an Extraordinary Meeting focusing on the proposed *West of Ifield* development. Here's a summary of what was discussed and decided.

Full Council Meeting – 30th September 2025

The Council met to review a range of local matters and community projects.

CAGNE Funding:

The Council agreed to award £2,000 under Section 137 to *CAGNE (Communities Against Gatwick Noise and Emissions)* to help fund legal fees for a Judicial Review of the Gatwick runway expansion.

Planning Matters:

The Council strongly objected to the *West of Ifield* application (DC/25/1312), citing serious concerns about environmental impact, transport, and infrastructure.

Finance:

Financial reports for July and August were approved, including the purchase of a Remembrance poppy wreath (up to £50).

Rusper Sports Club:

Discussions continued on the pitch security following recent incidents of vehicles entering the grounds. The football club will install posts to prevent further access.

Highways & Open Spaces:

The Council noted that its 20/30/40mph TRO application was refused by WSCC but approved the SID socket licence application for Horsham Road. Fingerpost maintenance will begin in October, and missing posts are being investigated.

Playground Improvements:

Following a tender process compliant with the Procurement Act 2023, Wicksteed was appointed to supply and install a new slide and playground apparatus.

Planning Committee Meeting – 16th September 2025

The Committee reviewed several planning applications and reaffirmed that all decisions must take into account the climate crisis and potential environmental impacts.

Applications Considered:

- Hawksbourne Wood (DC/25/1346): Retrospective wildlife pond – *no objection*.
- Nelson's Farm (DC/25/1383/84): Agricultural building – *no objection*, subject to suitable materials.
- Ashfolds (DC/25/1256): Extension and conversion – *objected* due to overdevelopment and parking concerns.
- Carylls, Faygate (DC/25/1197): Additional residential units – *no objection*.
- Outaway, Bonnetts Lane (DC/25/1207): Hardstanding for airport parking – *objected* due to inappropriate countryside development, traffic, and noise issues.
- Wood End Farm (DC/25/1121): Cattle shed – *no objection*.
- Averys (CA/25/0098): Tree works – *no objection*, subject to the Tree Officer's advice.
- Stafford House (DC/25/1348): Variation of conditions – *objected* on grounds of overdevelopment.

Major Application – West of Ifield (DC/25/1312):

Councillors raised significant concerns regarding:

- Traffic congestion and public transport
- Loss of countryside and landscape character
- Biodiversity loss and flooding risks
- Pressure on local services and infrastructure

A draft objection was to be prepared by 30th September, with the final version submitted before the 12th October 2025 deadline.

Extraordinary Parish Council Meeting – 18th September 2025

This special meeting focused solely on Homes England's application (DC/25/1312) for the proposed *West of Ifield* development.

Attendance:

Eight councillors, representatives from Homes England, Save West of Ifield, District Cllr Tony Hogben, and 41 members of the public attended.

Homes England Presentation:

The developer outlined the scale of the proposed 3,000-home development, community facilities, and infrastructure improvements. A copy of the presentation is available on the Parish Council website.

Public Forum:

Residents raised numerous questions and concerns about the environmental impact, infrastructure strain, and loss of rural character. Written responses will be provided by the Clerk.

Save West of Ifield Presentation:

Representatives set out their objections to the scheme and encouraged residents to respond to Horsham District Council's consultation.

The Parish Council confirmed that its formal response will be agreed at the meeting on 30th September 2025, ahead of the consultation deadline on 12th October 2025.

Looking Ahead

The next Full Council meeting will review progress on bank accounts, fingerpost maintenance, and the 2026/27 budget.

SAVE WEST OF IFIELD CAMPAIGN

At the time of writing – mid October – there have been 338 responses to Homes England’s planning application from members of the public, posted on the Horsham Council website. We can’t be 100% sure that all 338 are objecting to the West of Ifield, but all those we’ve read do seem to be. And we’ve read a lot.

If you haven’t submitted your views yet, then you still can. We can all submit right up until the application goes to Horsham’s Planning Committee for a decision. And that won’t happen this side of Christmas. You can also submit several times if, for example, more information is available from Homes England, or you just want to make additional points. Plus more than one member of the same household can submit views. The **Rusper Parish Council** website is also a great source of information. The videos and slidepacks (presentations) from the Extraordinary meeting on 18th September give the viewpoints of both Homes England and Save West of Ifield. There have also been 25 **responses from official bodies** so far, and it’s interesting to see how negative and challenging some of them are.

Thames Water: *“has identified that the existing FOUL WATER network does not have sufficient capacity to support the proposed development”.*

The Environment Agency: *“The application contains inadequate environmental assessments which do not consider impacts on aquatic habitats ... Impacts of the proposed bridge crossing and access road, including on hydromorphology of the River Mole and existing floodplain*

habitats, have not been considered ... Biodiversity Net Gain assessments have not been prepared in line with the Statutory Biodiversity Metric User Guide', including lacking adequate baseline or post-development assessments of watercourses ... There are concerns about achievability of the projected yields [of groundwater from on-site boreholes]".

Sussex Wildlife Trust "objects in principle to this application, which proposes to develop a large green-field site supporting numerous recognised wildlife sites and natural capital assets, such as wetlands and ancient woodlands. ... It is our view that adequate mitigation and compensation has not been provided"

Sussex Ornithological Society objects: "The land which it is proposed to use for this development is of considerable value in terms of bird numbers and diversity of species".

The British Horse Society: "It is apparent that equestrians, vulnerable road users equal to cyclists, have been entirely disregarded".

Historic England advises: "The proposals cause harm to the significance of the Medieval moated site at Ifield Court (scheduled monument) and St Margaret's Church (Grade I listed)".

WSCC Highways has raised many concerns, including:

- The deliverability of the bus strategy (also raised by **Metrobus**)
- That the shift away from car-use towards cycling, walking and buses is "very ambitious" and not evidenced (also raised by **National Highways**)
- The proposed route for construction traffic is unsafe.
